LIBRARY

We are only one month into the school year and already our library is a busy place. The library was excited to be a part of our School Council's open house event, where student volunteers supervised the sale of books that had been weeded from our collection. We are happy that so many books were able to find new homes and want to thank our school community for the \$135.90 in donations as well as the School Council for organizing such a great event. In addition, the first month of the school year has seen students check out 470 books, including 160 picture books, 120 novels, and 75 non-fiction books from the natural sciences and mathematics section.

Students are using a new check-out procedure this year, which will help to keep our bookshelves organized—each student has their own library card. The card doubles as a shelf marker that can be used to hold the place of a book that students are considering checking-out, so that they can return it to the correct spot on the shelves if they decide to keep searching for a good fit book.

Just a reminder that the library catalog is available online. Students can access the website by clicking the *Online Library* button on the school homepage. Along with searching our library resources, students can also read electronic books and link to online databases. The site has a lot to offer and students are being reminded of its features during their library periods, but you are encouraged to take a look at it at home as well.
