On February 10, the new Kindergarten Communication of Learning reporting document developed by the Ministry of Education will be sent home for our Year 1 and Year 2 Kindergarten students as well as a Term 1 Provincial Report Card for students in grades 1 – 8.

Kindergarten Communication of Learning:

The new Kindergarten Communication of Learning reporting document will provide parents/guardians with comments about their child's strengths and growth in relation to the overall expectations of The Kindergarten Program (2016).

Provincial Report Cards:

The Report Card for our students in grades 1 - 8 outlines student achievement based on the Ontario Curriculum. It provides information to our parents about how your child's achievement and progress compare to provincial expectations and standards. From Grades 1 to 6, achievement is indicated by a letter grade (A, B, C or D.) Grades 7 to 8, achievement is indicated by a percentage grade.

The comments will reflect the student's achievement of the curriculum expectations in each subject. Comments indicate student strengths, weaknesses and the next steps required to improve achievement. The teacher may suggest ways that student achievement can be supported at home. If the IEP box is checked on your child's report card, it means that an Individual Education Plan has been developed for them. The IEP may mean that accommodation has been made to help them meet the provincial standard for that grade or it may mean that your child's program has been modified. For example, a child may be working on expectations from another grade. It is very important to refer to the IEP when reading the report card.

Learning Skills:

The Learning Skills section of the report card indicates how students learn rather than what they learn. These skills are critical for success at school and in life.

Follow Up:

After reading the report card, choose a quiet time when you can talk about it with your child. Ask them to tell you what they are proud of and what their concerns are. Take care not to compare your child's report with any other student's report. Discuss only their report and help your child set goals for the coming term.

The Response Form is an opportunity for students and parents to comment on student achievement, strengths and weaknesses. This is where students should set goals for Improvement and where parents may indicate how they will support their child to achieve these goals. Both students and parents sign this page and it is kept in the Ontario Student Record.



We recognize and appreciate your continued support throughout the year. If you have any questions or require clarification regarding your child's achievement, please contact your child's teacher at your earliest convenience. We continue to be extremely proud of the hard work and the learning that takes place within the walls of our school every day!
