Health Alert / Allergies

We have several children and a staff member in our school who has severe allergies. Some of our students have a high sensitivity that may threaten their lives. This is referred to as Anaphylaxis. Anaphylaxis is a life threatening allergic reaction.



It can be triggered by accidentally inhaling, injecting, or absorbing an allergen. Some sources include:

- Foods
- Peanuts
- Insect Stings
- Latex

We Need Your Help!

No guarantee can be made about keeping our school peanut free. However, we need your co-operation and request that parents pack peanut- free lunches and snacks. Please do not sent to school any nuts, or nut products, or peanuts and peanut products, or products that state "may contain traces of nuts or peanuts". Please teach and remind your child not to share or trade food at any time.

At this time, we are also instituting other measures to create an appropriate learning environment. We are asking that all food be eaten in the classroom(s) or designated areas, not outside the school or on school busses. We encourage students not to share snacks with others.

I would like to thank you in advance for your co-operation and support in this matter.

Oral Medication!

If your child requires oral medication during the school day, a medical administration form must be filled out by parent and doctor. Please call the office to have a form sent home OR visit our website where you may print off a form directly from home!

Communication

To improve communication we ask all students from Grade 1 to 8 have an agenda. The cost of the agenda is \$7.00. In the front of each agenda there is a pouch provided to hold notes and letters of communication

home, so please check this pouch from time to time. It is recommended that routines should be established from the start like students putting their agenda in a consistent place where parents can read information coming home from the school. We ask that all parents take the time to read and initial your child's agenda every night. Together we can ensure that communication to and from school is clear and consistent. Students benefit so much when parents and teachers stay in touch! Let's keep the lines of communication open!

Playground Safety

For the safety of our students, it is expected that in order to use the playground equipment, footwear must be flat and have a closed toe and heal. Thank you for your support.

Physical Education

Students will be participating in regular physical education classes. Classes are designed to increase the fitness level of our students and encourage a healthy lifestyle. If you wish your child excused for health reasons, please send a note to the teacher. We ask that students have proper footwear to change into for all physical education classes (indoor running shoes). For our older student (gr. 4-8), we also ask that a clean pair of gym clothes (t-shirt and shorts) are available to change into.

School Traffic

We ask that you obey the following traffic rules:

- 1. Please obey all *one way*, exit, entrance signs and markings that have been freshly painted on the asphalt entering and leaving the parking lot.
- 2. Park in the church parking lot if at all possible.
- 3. Do not park in the driveways and handicapped spaces.
- 4. Do not double park and hem other parents in.
- 5. Please do not park in the bus loading zone. Bus arrives at 8:45 a.m. and 3:25 p.m.
- 6. Please feel free to use the bus loading area as a kiss and ride area before and after the above approximate times. Your child can safely walk down the pathway to the yard. This is the safest passage way and is encouraged.
- 7. Parking along the fence is posted for Kindergarten parents only.
- 8. When exiting "right" out of the parking lot, please watch for students crossing with the crossing guard. Please allow them the right of way.

Port Weller has voicemail, so calls can be made at any time during the day or evening. We are very conscience of the safety of the students. Regular phoning by parents will inform us immediately of the whereabouts of students not in school, and it will save us time in getting this information. We will call the homes, workplace and, if necessary, the emergency number of parents whose children do not arrive at school and about whom we do not receive a telephone call. Student Verification forms are being sent home with this newsletter. We ask that you make any corrections, sign the back, and return it to the school (even if no corrections are required). We think it is very important that we have the most up-to-date information on your child in case of an



emergency. That way we can easily determine changes that need to be made on the board data system.
